Planting Wildflowers planted for the first year along the entire eight miles of the trail with wildflowers thanks to our generous donors like you.

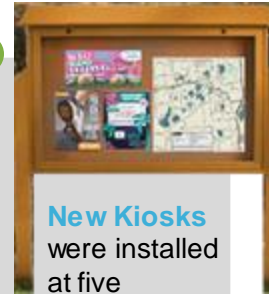


Light the Trail Party to celebrate the holiday spirit along the trail! We had a visit from the Grinch, as well as a face painter, treats, and activities for kids.

Height of the tallest point of arch on the bridge

64 cables (32 per side - illustration is not accurate)



The weight of the bridge structure is **800,000 lbs.**

This is equal to the weight of **10** fully loaded semi-trucks or **80** elephants.



The bridge can carry a weight of **445,000 lbs.**, which is equal to the weight of **45** elephants or **six** fully loaded semi-trucks.



The structure is called a **"network tied arch."** The bridge deck ties the ends of the arch ribs together, just like the string in a bow used for archery, and the crisscrossing hanger cables form a network pattern.



This structure has a **dou-
bly-curved deck**, making it the only network-tied arch bridge in the world with a doubly-curved tie.

NORTHAVEN TRAIL PRAIRIE CREW

The Northaven Trail Prairie Crew – a collaborative effort between The Flow Project and Friends of Northaven Trail – is a paid internship program intended to create citizen scientists out of today’s youth. Over the course of nine weeks, selected students work alongside mentors from a variety of local environmental programs to restore the Blackland Prairie along the Northaven Trail by planting and nurturing species native to the area. Through this experience, crew members learn the ins and outs of conservation, gain valuable environmental career experience, and prepare to act as stewards of the environment for the rest of their lives.



Program Objectives

- **Inspiration and mentorship** for the next generation of climate leaders
- **Enriched conservation efforts** in the North Texas area
- Improved **community awareness** of restoration initiatives
- **Environmental career experience** for student participants
- Continuing volunteer opportunities and **potential leadership roles** for past crew members
- **Year-round blooms** for trail-goers to enjoy
- **Enhanced connection between people and pollinators** – between ordinary citizens and the world in which they live

A Message from Our President

Thanks for your continued support of FoNHT! It's been another exciting year for us and the trail. We've been able to accomplish so much thanks to your donations.

Some of our highlights for the past year include:

- extensive rewilding efforts, including new native plants near the Bachman Creek Bridge and wildflowers the full length of the trail
- planted four new flower beds and installed drip irrigation system at the Pensive Respite
- 400 milkweed plants to help support monarch butterfly migration
- installation of new kiosks at five locations
- multiple events, including Love Your Trail Day, Coffee on the Trail, and Movie Night
- most recently, we've entered into a new partnership with the Flow Project to hire and pay interns to learn about conservation and work on trail landscaping efforts

We're especially excited about our expansion efforts as the construction of the new Northaven Trail Bridge over Central Expressway is nearing completion. When finished, the bridge will open up the City's trail network by connecting the Northaven Trail with the White Rock Creek and Cottonwood Creek trails, as well as the SoPAC Trail in 2024.

All of this and more is possible thanks to your generosity. We hope you will continue to support FoNHT as the trail expands east across the highway!
